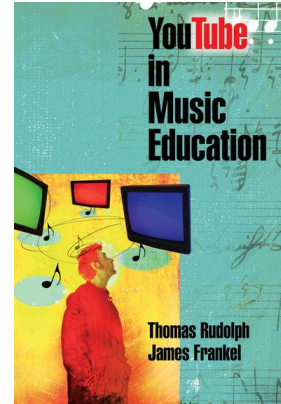

Part 1: Selecting the Equipment

1. The camera and necessary accessories
2. External microphone
3. Computer video editing software to create the final version of your videos

A. Using a Webcam or Computer build-in Camera

B. Using a Video Camera

1. [Kodak PlayTouch Video Camera](#) - \$90-\$120
2. [Floor standing tripod](#) for your video camera.
Sony VCT-R100 Lightweight Compact Tripod with 3-Way Pan/Tilt Head - \$34.99
3. *External Microphone*
 - a. [Audio-Technica ATR-3350](#) Lavalier Omnidirectional Condenser Microphone
4. *Video Editing Software*
 - a. Comes with most Cameras.
 - b. I recommend using Apple's QuickTime Pro for Mac and Windows (\$29.99). <https://www.apple.com/quicktime/extending/>
 - c. Also iMovie (Mac) and Moviemaker (Windows)
5. Upload to YouTube use *Apple QuickTime 10.2* (free for Mac and Windows)

C. Screencasts

- a. Apple QuickTime 10.2 can also be used to create a screen cast of the computer screen. <http://www.apple.com/quicktime/download/>

PART 2: Uploading Videos:

1. Know your YouTube email and password.
2. Upload from the Camera or QuickTime.
3. Make the settings as you desire
 - a. Private
 - b. Teacher-controlled comments
4. Share the Web link to the video.

PART 3: Teaching Applications

1. Teacher tutorials and lessons for students to view.
 - a. Screen casts of the computer
 - b. Live recordings
 - c. Interviews
 - d. Lessons
2. Student performances for students and parents.
 - a. Students can make comments about videos (approved by teacher)
3. Students upload recordings of a performance or practice session.
